NHS Home Eye Test – Eligibility Criteria

You may be eligible for a free NHS eye test at home if you:

- Have a condition that prevents you from leaving your home unaccompanied due to poor health
- Are diagnosed with a mental health condition that means you cannot leave the house without assistance
- Are housebound or bedbound due to a physical disability

Example Conditions

There are many reasons someone may be unable to leave home unaccompanied — here are some common examples (not an exhaustive list):

- Cognitive impairment
- Dementia
- Memory problems
- Diagnosed mental illness
- Severe arthritis
- Mobility difficulties
- Temporary illness affecting ability to go out alone
- Temporary condition (e.g. vertigo)
- Illness needing constant medication (e.g. oxygen)
- Advised by a medical professional not to leave home without help
